Course Selection & Instructional Fees

The Wawasee Yacht Club Junior Sailing Program offers two class options – **Basic and Advanced**. The curriculum is progressive in nature and is based upon US Sailing's proven "Learn to Sail" program. (US SAILING is the National Governing Body for the sport of sailing and sailboat racing in the United States.)

** Class descriptions are shown below. **The curriculum for each Basic class is identical.** If you have any questions regarding which level is appropriate for your sailor, please contact the program director for assistance.

Basic

Recommended for *all* sailors ages 8-13. Sailors will be grouped daily according to experience, size, and ability. New or less experienced sailors will focus on the more basic elements of sailing, including boat handling, wind awareness, and safety. Newer, smaller sailors may initially sail with a partner, however, will transition to solo sailing as basic skills are mastered and physical ability is demonstrated. All sailors will be increasingly and appropriately challenged as skills are developed and proficiency is shown. Destination "voyages" are common. More experienced sailors will be introduced to the fundamentals of racing.

Boat types: Optimist, O'pen Bic, Sunfish

Advanced (Racing)

Cost

Recommended for experienced sailors ages 13-15. Sailors will focus on practicing advanced boathandling techniques, racing skills, and team-work aboard multi-crew boats. A variety of boats will be used. Advanced sailors must be more physically and emotionally mature, in addition to having completed multiple Basic classes. Advanced sailors will be encouraged to crew aboard Lightnings or E-Scows, and/or to race Sunfish during WYC fleet racing.

Parent's Bill of Rights

The Wawasee Yacht Club Junior Sailing Program believes that parents of junior sailors have rights and that their questions regarding the program are reasonable and important. Furthermore,

- Parents have the right to know that their children will be safe with the instructors both physically and emotionally.
- Parents have the right to know that the instructors are experienced in the sport of sailing and are familiar with proper safety procedures on and off the water.
- Parents have the right to know that all children will be treated fairly and with respect.
- Parents have the right to know that all equipment shall be in safe and working condition.
- Parents have the right to know that any negative or cruel behavior amongst the students or between the students and the instructors will not be tolerated.
- Parents have the right to know that the instructors will conduct themselves in a professional manner at all times.
- Parents have the right to know that they can approach the instructors at any time with any concern, and that the instructors will listen carefully to their concerns and will do everything possible to address the issue.
- Parents have the right to know that their children will learn, improve, and have fun with the sport of sailing.
- Parents have the right to know that the program is open in nature and that parents are encouraged to observe or participate in a helpful manner.

Junior Sailors' Code of Conduct

In order to maintain a safe and enjoyable learning environment, Wawasee Yacht Club Junior Sailors are expected to act in a safe, mature, responsible, and sportsmanlike manner, upholding all rules and regulations of the Junior Sailing Program and the Wawasee Yacht Club. Additionally, Junior Sailors are expected to adhere to the following:

- Junior sailors will treat fellow sailors with respect.
- Junior sailors will treat instructors with respect and will respect their authority during the program.
- Disruptive behavior will not be tolerated.
- Unauthorized, unsupervised swimming is strictly prohibited.
- Junior sailors will wear their Coast Guard approved PFD's while on or near the water.
- Any costs arising from the intentional abuse, misuse, or vandalism of WYC property resulting in damage requiring repair will be the responsibility of the junior sailor and his/her parents or guardians.

The Wawasee Yacht Club Junior Sailing Program employs a "zero tolerance" policy with regard to prohibited activities or disruptive behavior during program hours, or on program premises. This includes the use of alcohol, the illegal use of controlled substances, and the carrying of firearms, or similarly dangerous weapons. Violation of this policy results in immediate dismissal from the program. There will be no refunds or proration of fees for suspensions or expulsions in connection with misconduct.
